Dear District 23 Zontians,

'Welcome home' to those who travelled to New York for the 57th Zonta International Convention. It was the largest ever Zonta Convention, with 2,873 members and guests registered from 59 countries. After the United States, Australia had the 4th largest group with 95 registered from Districts 23 and 24.

Sadly, Past Area 4 Director Mary Mulvahil (Bendigo) passed away just before Convention. A strong contingent of District 23 members attended the Convention Memorial service, and later made a donation to the ZI Rose Fund in memory of Mary.

Convention was exciting, inspirational and great fun. Club delegates and proxy holders have come home with lots of current information to share with you at club meetings. Since <u>our</u> District will host the next International Convention we all came home with lots of ideas and pages of notes.

Many of us met Mary Ellen Bittner at our District 23 Conference in Bunbury or on her visit to Melbourne to begin planning for Convention 2006, so we took a special interest and pleasure in her installation as Zonta International President 2004-2006.

Delegates to Convention 2004 endorsed the Theme and Goals proposed by International President Mary Ellen Bittner. These follow closely the International Theme and Goals for 2002-2004, providing continuity that will be helpful for clubs and districts. At our first meeting, in September, District Board will consider the actions District 23 might take to implement these goals.

Theme:

Advancing the Status of Women Worldwide

International Goals:

• Focus on our Mission.

Club reporting from 2002-2004 showed that District 23 clubs are already concentrating service and advocacy efforts on projects that aim to advance the status of women. Jenny Weaver, chairman of the Status of Women Service committee and Barbara Spring, Service coordinator will help clubs to continue this focus through the new Biennium.

• Combine Service and Advocacy

Marilyn Piper will continue in the role of District Legislative Awareness and Advocacy Coordinator. Each club has a copy of the *District 23 Advocacy Kit* filed in the *Handbook for Club Presidents*.

Kay Poustie, Past District 23 Governor, has been appointed to the Zonta International Status of Women Service Committee as Legislative Awareness and Advocacy Coordinator for the 2004-2006 biennium.

• Recruit, Retain, Rejuvenate

Members who attended Convention certainly came home rejuvenated. Their enthusiasm is highly infectious and should be passed on. Lt Governor Beryl McMillan will work with District Centurions Ellen Cox, Pauline Burton and Margaret Bird to help club membership committees recruit new members and support current members.

Each club has a copy of an excellent new resource the **Public Relations Toolkit**. Published recently by Zonta International, the 'toolkit' has good advice for improved communication within Zonta and to the community.

Nan Martella is our District PR Chairman for this Biennium, reporting to International PR Chairman Dawn Newman. They have co-opted us all as members of the Public Relations Team.

• Support the Z I Service Program Goals

International President Mary Ellen Bittner asks us to expand our support for international service programs by contributing as clubs and as individuals to the Zonta International Foundation. In the last Biennium <u>every</u> District 23 club made a donation to the Foundation. Our contributions totalled a record \$AUD \$89,649: this significant increase in our contributions was formally recognised at Convention.

Past District Governor Liz Woodgate is our link to the Zonta International Foundation as District 23 Foundation Ambassador for 2004-2006.

2004-2006 International Service Projects

Convention 2004 voted to support a new Project, with CARE International in Niger and to continue support for the *STAR Network anti -trafficking* project and the Afghanistan *Improving women's lives* project. District 23, District 24 and District 16 Zontians did a fantastic job staffing our Convention 2006 Information Booth, handing out koalas, travel brochures and good advice. Special silk scarves in Convention 2006 colours identified District 23 Zontians. As delegates left the final session they were given fridge magnets carrying the Convention logo and dates. We hope these will be a constant reminder of Melbourne 2006 on fridges across the world for the next 2 years.
