Changes to our Mission Statement and Objects

As these were changed at Convention we must now ensure that all of our documents reflect the changes – please check and alter.

The Mission Statement now reads:

Zonta International is a global organization of executives and professionals working together to advance the status of women worldwide through service and advocacy.

Objects now read:

• To improve the legal, political, economic, educational, health and professional status

of women through service and advocacy

- To work for the advancement of understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of executives in business and the professions
- To promote justice and universal respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms
- To be united internationally to foster high ethical standards, to implement service programs and to provide mutual support and fellowship for members who serve their communities, their nations and the world.

Position Papers Coming

With the added emphasis on advocacy, ZI is developing advocacy policy papers to be used by clubs. The first two papers will focus on Zonta priorities: trafficking of women and girls, and improving female access to education.

Around the entire Zonta world, there will be topics in common covered at District Conferences during this biennium. Information from reports of these will be used to produce further position papers, thereby providing more resources for our use.
