

A busy year!

Welcome to another year in Zonta. Some

CONVENTION 2008

Error in printed version of Call to Convention

All clubs should have received the following message from the Convention Committee via their Area Director, but the information is reproduced below for members who may be registering by mail or fax.

Unfortunately we need to inform you about a mistake in the **hardcopy version** of the Call to Convention (printed in *The Zontian*) of the Registration form for the Zonta Rotterdam 2008 Convention. It concerns the Payment Details on page 21.

The mistake on page 21 of the printed Call to Convention concerns the publication of the IBAN bank code. This wrong mentioned IBAN code belongs to CONGREX, and is <u>not</u> the IBAN code of ZONTA. On page 17 the IBAN bank code is correct. The BIC code is correct on both pages: ABNANL2A

The wrong IBAN code on page 21 is: NL54ABN0494687754. The correct IBAN code on page 21 is: NL24ABNA0567051943.

Due to the wrong IBAN code, payments by bank from abroad can not be made, if people use the wrong IBAN code as published

on the printed Registration form page 21 in The Zontian.

The information on the websites www.zonta2008.com and www.zonta.org are correct.

The IBAN code is correct in the digital Call to Convention that can be downloaded from the websites.

All Zontians who register via the website will not have any problem as all the information there is correct.

On behalf of Congrex, our organizing secretariat, we apologize for this mistake and for the inconvenience for the members. We are going to solve the problem as follows: in case we receive a hardcopy/printed Registration form by fax or post with the wrong IBAN code, we will immediately send an invoice with an explanation and the right IBAN code. We will send this letter by fax, post and/or email.

We will <u>not</u> mention this mistake on the website because we presume that Zontians who register via a hardcopy/printed Registration form will not use the website for information. Only Zontians who use the internet will see then this message and we think that this will be confusing for them (as all the codes on the website are correct). So far almost 100% of the registered participants, registered online. We therefore have the impression that only a few Zontians have to deal with this problem.

Membership - What is service?

I was recently asked to give a presentation at the 25th anniversary dinner of the Zonta Club of Adelaide Flinders Inc. The topic I was asked to speak on was service, as the club was recognising the service that all members had given the club over the 25 years. I felt that I would like to share my ideas about service with you too, as service is part of membership. We have had fantastic growth in membership since May 2007 and clubs have inducted 41 new members and I know there are more waiting in the wings. Don't forget to retain these members and support them.

Service as defined in the Oxford Dictionary describes an act of assistance, friendly help, professional aid, work done or duty performed for others as well as the usual serving food, religious ceremony, set of utensils used for serving as in a tea service, and the act or manner of serving the ball in tennis. The word has many meanings and it comes from the Latin word 'servus' or translated slave. Now I am not suggesting that we are slaves to Zonta, although at times one may think this when organising functions, but rather focus on the magnificent service that we have provided to the world.

When we join Zonta we are reminded that we must serve enthusiastically when called on to do so. Each person is unique in Zonta and everyone's motivation for serving will be different. There will be the altruistic person providing service for the benefit of others, giving back where the person may have benefited from the organisation in some way and wants to give back, a sense of duty where the person sees their service as a responsibility of citizenship. Some people describe that doing service makes their life better and so for them it is about their quality of life. For others

the service work may add to career prospects and personal development. For me service is about the fun of Zonta. Meeting fabulous people all over the world from different walks of life and giving to service in whatever capacity I choose when called on to do so. For me this is significant as it about having choice. This choice allows for personal talents to be used to the fullest.

The International and District Service goals are:

- To provide mission focused service, locally and globally, in order to improve women's legal rights, health, education, and economic status, and to prevent violence against women; and
- Combine service with advocacy to enhance the effects of our work.

In our clubs we do this through applying the project test to what we do. If all the statements above are answered in the affirmative, then we have the right service project. That project can be any number of things and I am sure that you could all go back through your club's records and identify whom you have served and how you have served them.

As you are all aware the **District** service projects are the breast cushions and the birthing kits. These projects have been amazing and have given club members satisfaction in showing their service skills – sewing on a machine and by hand, stuffing (make sure it is only 125gms!), packing, wrapping and of course the most important afternoon tea service!

At the District conference held in Hobart in September another service project was added to the District projects and this is the Yarri Wada: Strong for Country Puppet project. The women elders of three clans in the Western Kimberley want to secure a future for their young people and we are

hoping through this service Zonta will make a difference to this indigenous community.

International service projects are chosen each biennium and currently they are:

- Afghan Institute of Learning
- Working with Care International we are providing support for AIDS affected women and children in Niger Phase II through the Mata Masu Dubara (Women on the Move) project.
- Working with the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation we are supporting the revival of women's economic self sufficiency initiatives in Sri Lanka.
- With Care International we are providing education and leadership training for girls and women in Bolivia.

This snapshot of our service to the community to advance the status of women is many hours in a voluntary capacity. It is volunteers like us who provide service for whatever personal reason that keeps our clubs alive and successful.

For me personally, my service to Zonta is done as it fits with who I am and what I believe in. I hope that as you read this you have the same feeling. Zonta gives everyone the opportunity to achieve her own potential and for those of you who have friends who are not Zontians – perhaps you can consider whether we can be of service to them by asking them to join us. The personal approach to membership is often the best.

Is service slavery? Is slavery service? If at any time members feel that service has become slavery or that they have become a slave to service, it is time to reconsider why they are in Zonta. Let us look forward to the next 25 years of service to the community and growth for Zonta.

Hearing from our own District 23 recipients of Zonta awards at District Conference reminded us all of the importance of continuing our financial support for Zonta International Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Zonta International. The Foundation manages Zonta's educational awards, and funds our International Service and ZISVAW projects.

When several large tin money boxes were passed around the conference room and Zontians were invited to put their small change in the tins, your generosity was overwhelming. The Conference raffle was also strongly supported and the proceeds were donated to the Foundation. From the 'money box' collection and the raffle, District 23 forwarded a total \$1265 (US dollars) to the Foundation.

The Foundation booth, in the Conference marketplace, took personal donations from members and in the months since Conference both club and personal contributions have continued to roll in. We now have three clubs where most, if not all, members have made a personal donation to the Foundation and we are close to our goal of 100% of District 23 clubs making a contribution to the Foundation in the 2006-2008 biennium.

In Australian dollars, our District 23 contributions to 31 December total \$\$69,065. This figure includes personal donations of \$3,856.

Details of Zonta's 2006-2008 International service projects have been published in *The Zontian* and updates are posted on the web site www.zonta.org. Just click on the 'program update' image for the most recent information.

Through financial support from Zonta International Foundation, the CARE project in Niger is reducing

the risk of HIV/AIDS, and its physical, social, and economic consequences for at least 5,100 women and their families in the Bouza District of Niger.

Zonta's support for women in Afghanistan, through the Afghan Institute of Learning, continues in this biennium with the establishment of a new learning centre at Siyawashan in Herat Province.

In Bolivia, Zonta is funding a CARE project that supports Bolivia's Alternative Youth Education Program that helps working girls and young women, to address the barriers they face in their everyday lives. The project helps empower working girls and young women, enabling them to take control over their futures.

In Sri Lanka the initial donor support for Tsunami recovery focused on immediate humanitarian assistance and re-building housing and basic infrastructure. For the longer term it is crucial to revitalize local production. Zonta is helping The United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) to provide handson assistance to women and women's groups. For example, women farmers are being trained in efficient use of agricultural tools and equipment in to increase productivity, and in entrepreneurial skills so that they can participate in proactive self-help initiatives for income generation.

Annual Amelia Earhart Breakfast

Once again Frankston and Mornington clubs hosted a wonderful Amelia Earhart breakfast and a tour of the Peninsula exploring Dromana and Red Hill.

The guest speaker was Dr Jean Armstrong a 1991 Amelia Earhart Fellowship Winner. She spoke about what winning the scholarship meant to her and the work and research that she continues with in the area of digital communications. Jean has played a leading role in Australia in telecommunications research, in engineering education, tailoring the engineering course to provide relevant education for women and encouraging women engineers. In 1996 Dr Jean Armstrong was awarded an "Engineering 2000 Award" by the Institute of Engineers in recognition of her work on issues relating to women in engineering.

It was a very informative talk on the research involved in the development of optical fibres that carry more data over longer distances, greatly increasing the speed of existing internet lines. It was great to hear about the developments over the years and how Zonta contributed to the pathway of Jean Armstrong in these areas of research and in her life.

The **Zonta Club of Bunbury** combined its celebration of Amelia Earhart Day with an outdoors club fundraiser at the Myalup Vines Winery, near Bunbury.

150 people enjoyed ideal weather, great fellowship and fine wine and entertainment. Many took advantage of the sausage sizzle and cheese platters. Just over \$1,900 was raised for Zonta projects and visibility in the local newspaper rounded off a highly successful Zonta event.

News from Area 4

We are pleased that member numbers continue to increase in Area 4 and since June 2007 we have 19 new members with almost all clubs recording an increase over that time. It is encouraging to see clubs ensuring that they keep up the numbers despite some resignations along the way. At the Zonta Club of Bendigo we are delighted to be welcoming two babies into the club in the next few months. During the Christmas season clubs celebrated with members and partners but also remembered those less fortunate with donations of goods and money to local groups.

Preparations are well underway for International Women's Day celebrations across our area with many clubs already advertising gala dinners. The **Zonta Club of Ballarat** has an excellent dinner planned with guest speaker Dorothy Wickham who will address guests on the "Women of Eureka – the Centenary of Women's Suffrage". The club has also brought on board a large array of local and corporate sponsors and partners to support the event.

The **Zonta Club of Geelong** are going with a different concept for 2008 to celebrate IWD and are holding their Annual Awards Night as part of a community concert in Geelong as well as holding an Art Show – "Women-A Celebration" for both female and male artists the weekend prior to the IWD. The club was also successful in gaining a local Council grant for the event.

The **Zonta Club of Bendigo** will hold its 17th Annual International Women's Day Dinner now included in the calendar of events for the city's week long celebration of IWD and women's achievements. This year the speaker will be ABC's first female sports broadcaster and only female AFL Tribunal member Elaine Canty, and as a Director of the Royal Women's Hospital, funds from the evening will be donated to women's health. Bendigo also ran a most successful Gifts Galore day showcasing local produce and goods in the lead up to Christmas.

Over \$3,000 has been raised by the **Zonta Club of Melton** to support Women's Health West, Community Church Caring and Unifem. The club has also continued to support their community's Djerriwarrh Festival. The speaker for Melton's IWD dinner will be Bridget Muir – the first woman to climb Mt Everest so this should be a popular event for the club.

The **Zonta Club of Kyneton** has been busy with the local Kyneton combined service clubs Australia Day Breakfast and this followed on from a fellowship evening earlier in the week of twilight barefoot bowls!

The Zonta Club of Albury Wodonga continues to slowly build their club with 14 members now involved in their activities. The club held a theatre evening, has been involved in birthing kits (which continues to attract members to many clubs) health awareness days and continue to work on the carers room at the local hospital. They are also well known in the city for their annual Light up Christmas event.

Celebrations are in the air for the members of the **Zonta Club of Wangaratta** who are gearing up for their 20th Birthday party on the 15th March. The club members are hoping Zontians in Areas 1 and 4 will join them in the celebrations. The weekend will be combined with an Area 4 Presidents meeting.

Clubs in Area 4 continue to support our District projects by making breast cushions and assembling birthing kits and I urge clubs to renew their membership of the Birthing Kit Foundation.
