Zonta International Foundation Contributions

Thank you to all the clubs and individual members who made donations to the Zonta International Foundation in memory of our Past District Governor and District Chairman of Legislative Awareness & Advocacy, Kay Poustie.

I know Kay would have been delighted to learn of these contributions as she gave a lot of her time to Zonta to improve the status of women.

Wouldn't it be wonderful to have 100% of our clubs contributing to ZIF this biennium and earn another gold star as we did in the 2006-08 biennium!

As of 31 March only four District 23 clubs had not yet contributed.

I encourage these clubs to send a donation, **no matter how small**. This is our reason for belonging to an international service organisation; we are part of a big picture and we each pledge to advance the status of women worldwide.

The good news is that 71% of the total goal of \$4,020,000 has been received, however as you can see from the table below the contributions to Amelia Earhart Fellowship and International Service Funds are well below the desired goals.

Congratulations Zontians of District 23. Despite the global financial situation, plus local, national and international disasters during the biennium, donations to the Zonta International Foundation at the end of March total \$US110.343.87. Of course, there has been a little help from a strengthening Aussie dollar, so our money is going further.

Unfortunately, we were unable to continue our envious District record of 100% of our clubs contributing to the Foundation, with four clubs not having sent money (unless they have done so directly to ZIF in recent weeks). Though any further donations will not be included in totals acknowledged at Convention in San Antonio, there is still time this biennium to make a difference to the lives of the women who are supported by our international service projects, ZISVAW projects and our leadership programs. Perhaps those four clubs could make

a donation, no matter how small, directly to ZIF (easy to do online, or send by cheque to convention with your delegate or proxy), before the end of the biennium and maintain our our District. record!

The number of individuals making donations has increased over the past two biennia, however the exact number cannot be defined accurately, as some clubs have had individual contributions which have been submitted 'in bulk' as club donations.

Past DG Ronda Walker, our District ZIF Ambassador last biennium, encouraged Zontians to make individual contributions, and for clubs to have all members doing so, no matter how small or large the amount. How do I pay thee? ...let me count the ways

Is payment by cheque with the RSVP, the only option available on your club's invitations/fliers to club events and activities?

Have you considered accepting other methods of payment?

With the increased use and convenience of personal internet banking facilities, the need for a personal cheque book has diminished considerably. Some people don't have cheque books and some banks are no longer automatically sending a new cheque book when one is completed, unless specifically requested.

What additional payment options are available?

 Electronic funds transfer (EFT)/deposit into the Club bank account.

Provide BSB/Account details for fundraising events, (and dinners, fee payments etc) requesting payer to specify relevant reference and name. The bank confirmation advice can be emailed as proof of payment with the RSVP.

Paypal

Payments can be made online to a Club Paypal account and funds are transferred from the Paypal account to the Club bank account at designated intervals. This would require an account to be set up with Paypal and there are transaction fees involved. To

find out more, look up the Paypal website www.paypal.com.au

· Credit cards

This would require contacting your bank about EFTPOS/ Debit card/Credit card facilities. There are fees involved with this option, so Club's will need to assess whether the benefits outweigh the costs.

For many people these options are more convenient and may result in a more timely response and payment before the event/function. It's worth considering.

UN Updates

Two new initiatives were announced on IWD 2010. UNIFEM and the UN Global Compact partnership launched "Women's Empowerment Principles" which offers guidance on

how to empower women in the workplace. It calls for establishing high level corporate leadership for gender equality and promoting education, training and development for women.

Also, on March 8th, Secretary General Ban Ki-moon appointed the first female head official advisor of the UN Police Force. Ms Ann-Mare Orler's top priorities include lifting the percentage of female police officers to at least 20% in the role of peacekeepers by 2014.

Secretary General Ban Ki-moon stressed that

"the third Millennium Development Goal – to achieve gender equality and women's empowerment – is central to all the rest. When women are denied the opportunity to better themselves and their societies, we all lose. Until women and girls are liberated from poverty and injustice, all our goals – peace, security and sustainable development – stand in jeopardy."

UNIFEM

UNIFEM Australia released a schools' kit for IWD 2010 – Empowering Women to End Poverty by 2015 – outlining the 8 Millennium Development Goals, providing information and follow-up activities for students. It is hoped that all Zonta Z Club affiliated schools have access

to this kit. I can provide copies to any interested club.

UNITE Campaign

Zontians are still urged to add their signatures to the UNITE to End Violence Against Women Campaign on the home page of our Zonta International website.

The Secretary General has also launched a Network of Men



Leaders to strengthen advocacy in this campaign and urged all governments, organisations and individuals to do their part. The Zonta Club of Geelong is one example of taking this campaign out into the community and working with the local police force.

The club has funded a **Family Violence Workshop** for all police officers and also funded the printing of an emergency reference card for vulnerable women. (More on this project later.) The Geelong Club's Z Club has also produced antiviolence posters to display around the school.

Using Council Grants effectively

For some clubs, this is old news but for others, it might give you the impetus to look into what your local council can do for you.

In the last two years, Zonta Club of Melbourne on Yarra has been successful in obtaining two community grants for seminars organised within the City of Yarra.

The first featured violence against women and the second the importance of wills and estate planning. The grants helped defray the 'set up costs'.

Local councils in Melbourne, and no doubt across the country, hold information sessions and provide information and support on how to fill out a grant application. As our club had already been successful in gaining a community grant, our name was 'known'. I attended one of these functions last year and was encouraged to apply for an annual grant.

As a club we had decided on a health focus for our fundraising this year, raising funds for the National Breast and Ovarian Cancer Centre and for Go Red for Women.

One of the foci for grants in 2010 was sport and health. With help from the grants officers I devised a

programme for women over 50 living in the City of Yarra. The programme was to be a one hour walk, one hour health talk and a lunch.

The walk would start at one of the council's neighbourhood houses and the venue would be provided gratis. The lunch would be prepared by a catering company working at the neighbourhood house. Club members would attend each week to provide mentoring.

The grant took some time but, during the planning I received help from community workers at the neighbourhood house and grant officers from the City of Yarra. The grant was submitted in July. We were given a cheque to cover all the costs in December and an official grant award ceremony was held in January.

The grant will enable us to run the programme for eight weeks, with a variety of speakers on topics of particular interest to that age group with each session costing only \$5 which includes the lunch. The grant also provided for an interpreter but as this was not required it seems as though we can use the money to extend the programme. The programme will start in mid April. Local councils are anxious to

provide a variety of different programmes within their communities and we were looking for a service programme which didn't require fundraising. I hope this information is useful to other clubs.

Jane M Klausman Women in Business Scholarship 2010

Zonta International has conducted a review of this scholarship this year and is still in the process of rewriting the relevant documents and updating them on the ZI web site. Some, but not all, documents are now available. Consequently, promotion of this award is beginning later this year than in previous years.

The significant changes to the scholarship include:

- new District scholarships of US\$1000 funded by the ZI Foundation;
- eligibility extended to include those studying from the second year of an undergraduate degree up to the final year of a Masters degree;
- past recipients may not apply to renew the scholarship for a second year; and
- reference/referee contact information is to be provided by the applicant and checked by the nominating committee.

Birthing Kit Report

All clubs nationally should now have their new Promotional Folders.

These were funded under our AusAID Community Call 2 Action (CC2A) proposal, focusing on raising the awareness within the Australian public of the UN Millennium Development Goals. We are including how our Zonta Birthing Kit project addresses 4 of the goals.

Our CC2A proposal had several parts.

- Clubs holding information sessions about the MDGs and Birthing Kit Project
- An information folder, power point presentation and presentation booklet
- 95,000 kits being made at Assembly Days where attendees hear a presentation.
- 4. A 10 minute DVD on the MDGs and the Birthing Kit Project.
- 5. 5000 brochures
- WOMAD music festival in Adelaide (March 5 – 8), where potentially 80,000 people heard about the MDGs and birthing kits.

The folder is designed for use on a one to one basis or in small groups. A person can choose to read from the back page while people see the front page or read from the presentation booklet. We would like clubs to organise information sessions, anywhere people may gather, at stalls, in malls, at assembly days, fundraising events or dinner meetings.

There is also a 10 - 15 minute powerpoint presentation, designed for use with larger gatherings of people, like school assemblies and dinner meetings. The words are in an accompanying presentation

booklet which can be customised to the length of the presentation or adapted as the presenter feels necessary.

Our movie will be launched at our Mother's Day Morning Tea at Ayers House in May.

Most importantly members can use this as an opportunity to promote Zonta and its many projects to hopefully increase our public profile and membership

AusAID will want to know how successful our awareness raising project has been. How many people have been exposed to the Birthing Kit Project and UN Millennium Development Goals. We would like the *approximate* attendee numbers.

We will have a CC2A attendance form available on our website under 'EVENTS', or you can email CC2A@birthingkitfoundation.org.au with the following information – name of organisation, event, date, attendees, any other information and photos or videos.

All Assembly Day attendances are on the usual forms.

The BKFA has some funds allocated for mall or hall hire costs. We are a humanitarian organisation and we know Zontians will negotiate free space where possible. Email treasurer@birthingkitfoundation.org. au if costs are greater than \$50. We will inform clubs when the allocated funds are used. For reimbursement please submit a claim, with a receipt, as done for soap at assembly days.

The BKFA decided to be environmentally responsible and minimise our carbon footprint with an eco friendly folder and brochures made from recycled paper or certified forests along with waterless printing methods.

We hope you are as excited with it as we were.

Being cardboard the folder is not as

durable as the old plastic one, so please store it in its postage envelope for protection.

No more \$1 kits are available for Assembly Days at Schools.

There are videos to watch (Home page and Assembly Day page), lots of photos, detailed information on each project including our training programs, and the ability to donate to any aspect of the foundation you support.

Some Zonta clubs have chosen to support a training program rather than hold an Assembly Day. Frankston Zonta Club is funding \$2000 towards the training program in DR Congo. The Adelaide Hills Zonta Club likewise is funding \$2,000 towards the training program in Ethiopia.

There are many training programs the BKFA would like to support and as each of these programs is fully funded a new one will become available. Research shows that a training program that accompanies the kit distribution is the best way to educate women and have a lasting impact on the community.

Farewell to Jacqui Wathen our BKFA Project Manager as she pursues full time employment. It is with regret for the BKFA and Jacqui that we say good bye. She has been a great asset to our organisation, being friendly, efficient and passionate about our project. Jacqui will keep in touch as she continues to help on a voluntary basis.

Welcome to Fiona Smith our new Project Administrator. It is with great excitement that we welcome Fiona as she comes with many skills to take our organisation forward. Many Zontians will remember her mother, Liz Smith, who was an enthusiastic Zontian at executive level in Adelaide.

Please plan your next information day as a wonderful opportunity to showcase our national project, educate the public, as well as promote Zonta and its wonderful local, district and international projects.

In February, I attended the Zonta Club of Melbourne on Yarra dinner meeting at which the guest speaker shared her professional experience of "branding" a product and likened the Zonta product to any other, in that it needs to be a consistent message that has to be marketed across the board at every opportunity.

This was followed the next evening by a meeting with the Melbourne on Yarra 2011 Conference host club and incoming District Governor, Jane Smith, to put forward early plans for the 2011 Conference and to garner interest and commitment from members of Areas 1 and 4 clubs. There was enthusiastic response and we are all looking forward to the planning process.

Several interesting new projects are currently underway in Area 1:

- Domestic violence program (as run by several clubs in Areas 1& 4) for police officers
- School based breast examination project
- Collection of goods from individual members for the Asylum Seekers Resource Centre

Melbourne's West

 A partnership with local government and secondary schools to provide leadership training for Year 9 girls

Clubs in Area 1 are increasing their contacts with local councils and agencies and gaining grants to run partnership programs. (See article on page 5).

Given that Zonta is the "driver" in these programs which follow the organisational mission, it is an effective way of building community credibility and having funds to run them which might otherwise not have been possible

Following consultation with the FIREFOXES it was arranged to present a Zonta cheque for \$2000 after the 7th February anniversary of the devastating fires and on Thursday, 18th March we made our way to the Kinglake area to meet the three young women who formed the group. I was joined by ZC Melbourne's West members Ella Wood, Debbie Schmidt, Sandra Hall and from Melbourne on Yarra, Jennifer Garrison.

Jennifer is well acquainted with the community where she has been working as a counsellor across several fire-affected areas and has first-hand experience of the ongoing trauma faced by these communities. Kate, Alwyn and Jemima described their own experiences of the event (fortunately they did not lose property) and of the uncertainty and fear of not being able to escape.

We were taken to two of the original staging areas, where emergency food, essential goods and ablutions facilities were set up in the midst of the ravaged areas and where people could assemble in relative safety and get information about how others were faring and what was going on. We were also taken on a tour of the temporary village set up in Kinglake where many families and individuals who lost their homes have been provided with transitional housing while they consider whether they can rebuild or take other options. The FIREFOXES are continuing their excellent work in the community.
