Club members welcomed the women on arrival, provided them with a meal for the first night and enough provisions for them to be self sufficient for the rest of the week. For the first time the accommodation was based in central

Dunsborough so was within easy walking distance of all facilities and the beach. This way the women could do as they pleased. The only complaint was that when they went home they were very sore – from laughing so much!

Peel Club's 19th Golf & Auction Day was held at the Pinjarra Golf Course on the 1st April 2012. This event has been held annually for the past 19 years and was the inspiration of our Zontian and Charter Member Bev Jackson. To date an amount of \$167,000 has been raised for Breast Cancer Research in Western Australia from this event.

A luncheon is prepared by the Zontians of the **Peel** club each year. The South West Esther Foundation reported a very successful set-up outcome and thanked the **Bunbury** club for its assistance to purchase office computers, technical equipment and laptops for the young women in the program. The Non Traditional Trade Award was presented to Ashley Chitty for her achievements in Engineering (Fitter and Machinist). She is currently



employed by BHP Billiton Worsley Alumina. Ashley was highly recommended by her employer and she also won the Aboriginal Academic Award at the South West Institute of Technology Awards Night on the 30 March 2012.

Perth club has had a special relationship with the Senior Ngarinyin law women since 2004. This friendship was forged during a memorable camping trip when twelve Zontians met these inspirational women 'in country', sharing our stories, learning and listening... In 2007, five members made the return journey and stayed at the Ngallagunda Community that is on the Gibb River Station. Members

learned more about the culture, fished, cooked and played together and were privileged to be shown



some very special rock art and participate in traditional ceremonies. ## Area 5 Report

One of the most gratifying parts of being an Area Director is being able to represent and promote Zonta International in the public arena. One such example in my time in office has been my involvement with the Bendigo Bank Material Girl Art Prize for 2012.

Most Zonta clubs in Area 5 have been a part of Material Girl since its inception in 2002. The concept of an art prize specifically for Tasmanian women artists came from an initiative by Women Tasmania, an office of the Department of Premier and Cabinet. It was inaugurated on International Women's Day 2002 as a way to support this very special unsung group in our community. The concept was for an art competition specializing in textile to commemorate the thousands of women (and children) all around the world and through the ages, who have been exploited, used, abused and even enslaved by a multitude of textile industries from rug making to fashion garment manufacturing. We all know of the back street sweat shops here in Australia and even more so of the horrific working conditions found in these industries in countries such as Indonesia, China and India.

Over the ten years that the prize has been awarded, the parameters have been broadened until today it includes all forms of artistic endeavour; textiles, ceramics, painting, photography and more.

What more fitting project for the clubs of Area 5 to take up? The Material Girl exhibition travels around Tasmania, celebrating our women artists as well as clearly pronouncing our Zonta creed of supporting and advocating for women. How do the four Area 5 clubs participate? While the Bendigo Bank has come on board to finance the administration of the competition, the prize monies come from the three major sponsors; the Premier, Rio Tinto -Comalco and Zonta International. We couldn't be in more prestigious company.

This year it has been my privilege to be a member of the four person judging panel and because my artistic knowledge is fairly limited I have benefitted personally by meeting and being educated by my more expert fellow judges. And aren't personal development and networking some of the reasons that we encourage Zontians to take up higher office

Zonta Emerging Artist award

Little did the 6 Zontians cutting plastic on a Sunday afternoon to make the first 100 kits in 1999, know that they would be the catalyst for 1,000,000 kits being made 13 years later.

To celebrate this amazing milestone there are larger celebratory breakfasts/functions being organised in Adelaide, Sydney, Melbourne and Canberra during August and September.

The timing of our 1,000,000<sup>th</sup> kit in August with many Zontians being away from June through to August to attend the Convention in Torino in July, has resulted in Perth and Brisbane not being able to form committees, however, they will hold smaller functions at clubs. Having the 1 millionth kit Assembly Day on August 18 in Brisbane when 10,000 kits are assembled will in itself be a memorable event to attend.

We encourage Zonta clubs to support the larger city celebration event or hold their own regional functions. We also encourage smaller functions with clubs joining together to celebrate.

Alexander Downer's words "An enormous achievement. Very great congratulations. Incredible."

The prime function of these events is to celebrate our achievements, however, if there are any profits we would like them to go towards our programs, especially our training programs in Kenya, DR Congo, Ethiopia and India.

This is an opportunity for huge PR for Zonta and the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia).

The BKFA is asking each committee/ club to allow \$4/ticket for our PR package detailed below. Every function will receive a PR package. Let us know of your function and how many people you hope will attend, by contacting info@birthingkitfoundation.org.au to enable us to order accurately. The BKFA has state databases of supporters from high schools, university medical and midwifery students, church and Rotary groups for clubs to access.

Our PR package includes brochures, bequest booklets, donation envelopes, mauve balloons with ribbon and sticks, BKFA UN MDG film, DVD of overseas partners thanking our Zontians and supporters, DVD of photos of the women and babies we assist to run in the background, and donation collection tins, working on pull up banners and carry bags for the sponsorship goodies.



### Amelia Earhart Fellowship

#### Beth Jens - 2012 Amelia **Earhart Fellow**

Zonta International has announced the 35 Amelia Earhart Fellows for 2012 and among them is Beth Jens a budding astronaut who comes from Torquay in Victoria. On behalf of the District, I sent a congratulatory email to Beth and she sent a lovely reply that is summarised here.

Beth completed two undergraduate degrees in mechanical engineering and physics at the University of Melbourne in 2008. She spent two months in 2009 at the NASA Ames Research Centre completing the International Space University's Space Studies Program. In 2010 she commenced a Master of Aeronautics and Astronautics at Stanford University supported by the Australian Fulbright Scholarship in Science and Engineering and a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship. Her studies involve a mixture of course work and research and her favourite class to date was a series of three courses where she designed, built and tested a rocket. Her current PhD research looks at 'hybrid rocket combustion visualisation' and applications of hybrid rockets to outer planet exploration. She plans to

develop system designs for missions to Europa, Titan and Uranus.

Her lab work is being completed with the NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) through the Strategic University Research Partnership program and this year she will be spending her second summer as an intern in their propulsion group.

She explains, "I am absolutely delighted to be an Amelia Earhart Fellow in 2012. I have wanted to take part in the program ever since I first heard of it but had to wait until I was finally qualified to apply as a PhD candidate last year. It is an absolute privilege to receive the fellowship established in honour of such an incredible and inspirational woman. I am really looking forward to my coming 12 months as an Amelia Earhart Fellow.

"All in all, life at Stanford keeps me very busy and is certainly mentally challenging but I absolutely love what I do. The campus is a beautiful place to live and has fantastic facilities that I plan to do my best to take advantage of in the coming years. I had a great time taking horse riding classes on campus last quarter and hope to take this up again when I am back from JPL."

Applications for AE Fellowships are made directly to Zonta International and each AE Fellow receives US\$10,000.
