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Dear Zontians.

As this is my first contact with many of you for 2013 I hope all of you had a great summer break and I look forward to sharing a busy but productive Zonta year. I hope you were able to take time to catch up with family and friends and slow down for a while.

Your district board has held a very successful but busy meeting in Adelaide and my thanks go to AD Jodi, all board members and Adelaide clubs who supported us over the 2 days. Our Advocacy chairman, Pauline, Bylaws member Liz and Photographer Sally were able to join the meeting for a while on Saturday and thanks also to them for their input. The Board enjoyed the company of many SA Zontians and Dr Luc at dinner where many of us heard him speak for the first time.



Additional to normal board matters, the meeting spent time working on our D23 Strategic Plan, revising our D23 Rules of Procedure and our D23 Constitution which must be updated to meet the revised Incorporation Act in Victoria. We also reviewed much of the Club Handbook. Thanks go to non board members that I called on for input to these documents. Your board has work to do in finalising many of these so that they will be ready for the Business Call to Conference in early July. On the Monday after the Board meeting Secretary Bernadette and I travelled to Clare where I met President Nan and members over lunch, visited the Zonta Gardens and also was introduced to some Horrocks family history. On our way back to Adelaide we had time with Gawler President Pru and Naomi.

ZI has been extremely busy over what is our summer break and we have all received communication from them. News that may not have reached all members is that the CEO Jason Friske has resigned and ZI is currently seeking a replacement. ZIF has appointed a development manager and we were required to submit our district report in February which has resulted in more work for clubs and our district committees. I thank all of you for your input to this report.

There has been monthly e-News with many links to ZI and I encourage you to look at these so that you are aware just how many support pages and documents are on the ZI website. Use this knowledge that is so readily available.

We need to be active with our club histories as well as the 2 new initiatives, ZI Service Awards and ZontaSaysNo program, over the coming year. The district has printed **ZontaSaysNo** bookmarks which are currently being distributed to all clubs. I ask that you use these at every opportunity to not only get the message out, but also to increase our visibility. There are VAW toolkits on the [ZontaSaysNo](#) and also [AWAVA](#) websites. Look them up if your club is looking for ideas.

The recent [1 Billion Rising](#) in which many SA Zontians were involved has had great press including Michelle Bachelet presenting at **UN Women** and where the staff 'Stood up' against VAW. Log on to any of these sites and see the impressive work that is being done around the world by people of many backgrounds.

The [White Ribbon Foundation](#) is holding their International Conference in Sydney from 13-15 May – put this date in your diaries.

Encourage your club chairman to report events and seek assistance from their district chairman who report on to ZI. We have two D23 stories featured on Share your Story and I look forward to reading many more D23 uploads.

Congratulations to all clubs who acknowledged Amelia Earhart day in January – all are increasing our **visibility**.

AREA 2 REPORT

A quick review of the clubs recently showed many clubs reporting new members being inducted after having targeted membership drives. Our "club in the making" in Mt Barker has hosted its second fundraiser and is looking like a very committed and talented group of Zontians.

Planning activities for clubs also involved the members discussing how to get to know each other better in order to function more effectively as a team. Some clubs are already working on their constitution, which is one action listed in the District Goals for the biennium. I have been very excited about the various activities and projects Area 2 clubs have running that address

raising awareness about violence against women. This fits well into the 2013 ZI Initiative ZONTA says NO.

Individual Zontians are undertaking "acts of advocacy", making time to meet with local Members of Parliament to discuss concerns about planned changes to women's health services in South Australia and this is what we need to do more of.

With the ZI centenary approaching, many clubs are becoming more aware of archiving issues, especially when it

comes to storage and we are looking at how best to approach these concerns.

February 14 was a special day in South Australia, with activities in the city centre of Adelaide to commemorate 'V-Day – One Billion Rising'. Zontians from many clubs joined hundreds of men and women to speak out and dance to bring attention to violence against women around the world. An effective way to kick start ZONTA says NO!

Fundraising success continues with Bunbury raising over \$4000 for a Music in the Park event in January and Perth Northern Suburbs' decorated Duck auction on February 23 attracting significant media attention as part of the Perth World Fringe Festival.

On the advocacy front, Perth Club held an excellent cultural awareness day with fascinating speakers sharing their experiences of escaping war torn countries to live in Australia.

All clubs are in the throes of preparations for International Women's Day with displays planned for all events that include Zonta breakfasts in Bunbury, Mandurah and Dunsborough and Zonta co-hosting the major UN Women IWD breakfast in Perth. Zonta also features in research on women's groups being published as part of the WA Women's Hall of Fame celebrations.

Sadly charter member of the Zonta Club of Perth, Margaret Giles, passed away suddenly just before Christmas. Marg had been a Zontian for over 40 years and in November had been one of 8 members from the Perth club that travelled to Singapore to help the ZC Singapore celebrate its 40th Anniversary. Marg was a hard working, fun Zontian and gave exemplary service especially with the Zonta House Refuge, where she was a board member for over a decade. She will be sadly missed.

Devonport has inducted 1 new member; Launceston has some potential members to reinvigorate the club; and Hobart and Hobart Derwent both have potential members who are

attending meetings. Hobart Derwent is holding its second membership cocktail party on 7th March. The first cocktail party resulted in 5 new members. All active clubs continue to support the Breast Cushion Project or/and the Birthing Kits Project. Clubs support local projects that give them visibility: Hobart Derwent's Cheryl's Angels program supports girls in schools and Hobart's "Small Steps", in partnership with the City Mission, supports young mothers.

Area 5 is joining with Areas 1&4 for the Area Meeting on 23rd March in Melbourne. All Area 5 clubs will have members attending, which is very pleasing.

Area 5 looks forward to an exciting year of working to achieve Goal 1. With our small clubs, this may have to be achieved through partnerships with like-minded organisations such as Soroptimists or the City Mission.

The quest for suitable applicants for the JMK Women in Business Scholarship has begun for 2013. In the first week of February, all Area Directors and Club Presidents will have received the current information, forms and tools necessary for your Area or Club to take the necessary steps to find a JMK candidate. There are a number of ways you can approach this task.

Ask members if they know of any young woman in at least her second year of a Business Degree at a Tertiary institution

who may qualify. It is amazing how you may have someone close to one of you who may just fit the bill.

There is a sample of a Newspaper release that you may wish to use within your local, or wider community. If the news release is not to your liking, remember that it provides a solid framework of the information that should be conveyed.

You can approach your local Tertiary Institution. It is best to ring the University or Tertiary College first to

find out who to address the information to. For example, at Monash University there is a separate section that all scholarships are directed through.

In previous years we have chosen some incredible young women as our JMK candidates. I am sure that there are many other outstanding young women who would qualify as nomination we could put forward with pride.

It is up to all of us to find them.

When I mention Zonta's links with United Nations a frequent response is that there is too much, too many UN Days, too involved to grasp. It is true that the United Nations must be one of the largest and most diverse organisations on the earth but Zonta International is focussed on one segment of their activities, UNWomen. Further in our District goals this biennium we have chosen to focus on CEDAW (**C**onvention on the **E**limination of all forms of **D**iscrimination **A**gainst **W**omen) and the Millennium Development Goals.

What each Club in our District is asked to do is **CHOOSE** to support and advocate for an issue which is locally relevant, about which you are willing to

become informed and take action.

Whatever you choose to focus on to achieve Zonta's goal which are underpinned by UNWomen it is important that your involvement be of such a knowledgeable quality that your Club's credibility will be enhanced.

In addition it is smart to look out for partnerships and collaboration. For example International Women's Day on March 8th is another important date in the Zonta-UN Calendar. Many organisations including Zonta Clubs mark the day with events and keynote speakers, but perhaps not your Club. Look for IWD events locally which you could attend/support and is there an opportunity for increasing the

visibility of Zonta? [In Hobart there is a Big Breakfast where Zonta's only role is to put up a display about Zonta local and International Projects which advance the Status of Women.]

Inform...Choose...Act...and Achieve those goals which Zontians share with UNWomen which are relevant in your local community.

For the **2013 District Conference History** display, clubs will be invited to submit one photo that increases their club profile in the community and also invite clubs to bring some historical

material from their records. More information to follow later.

D23 is looking for a **District Historian** who will write our district history by April 2016, based on the submitted club histories received by April 2014. If you would like to be involved contact our History Chairman Lennie or Governor Ann.

Ideas on celebrating Zonta's 100 years and Australia's 40 years will be canvassed at area workshops. Please give some thought to this before then.

ZONTA SAYS NO

This 12 month promotion is in line with the UN-Unite focus this year on Elimination of VAW. It is not intended to replace White ribbons with another colour. Clubs are asked to focus on one main event this year which for many is White Ribbon Day.

A monetary award of \$1,000 plus certificate is given for 1st place, \$500 for 2nd place and \$250 for 3rd place. So good luck to any applications from our 4 eligible clubs – it certainly provides an incentive to aim for!

Exciting news from ZI Chairman Ute Scholz (Zonta Club of Verden, Germany) is that in 2012-14, the number of international YWPA recipients will increase from 5 to 10 and the international award will increase from US\$3,000 to US\$4,000.

The main goals of the international YWPA Committee in 2012 – 2014 are to:

- receive an international nomination from every District every year (all but one have done so in the last two years)

- increase of the number of clubs participating
- increase the visibility via website, social media and newsletter/mailings

D23 has been consistently putting forward a nominee for the international award, but only around one third of clubs have been nominating their winners for the D23 award. If your club has missed the boat this year, put it firmly on your agenda for the second half of the biennium.

The YWPA Award is the most popular Zonta Award and many clubs that take part get a lot of public attention for their local Zonta club and for Zonta International in general.

Celebrate your club winner in a public ceremony or open club meeting, with distinguished guests and local news agencies. YWPA winners make great guest speakers!

Having expressed a wish to meet other

ADELAIDE WHITE RIBBON BREAKFAST

Representatives from Zonta International, Soroptimist International, National Council of Women and Business & Professional women got together in 2008 to organise the first Adelaide White Ribbon Breakfast. Since then, this event has gone from strength to strength and the committee of seven has increased to include five White Ribbon Ambassadors, bringing a men's perspective to the event. Zonta representatives from Area 2 are Cintra Amos (Co-Convenor) and Di Cooper.

Our fifth annual Adelaide White Ribbon Breakfast was held on Friday 23 November 2012 at the Adelaide Festival Centre Banquet Room in the CBD, attracting a sold out crowd of nearly 500 guests. We were delighted to welcome both regular supporters and new ones.

This event celebrates UN International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, and the White Ribbon campaign is the first and largest male-led crusade to end violence against women worldwide. It was indeed satisfying to see the increasing number of men attending, and to see so many students and other young people embracing the cause. Zonta was well

represented with Zontians from several clubs among those attending, who included many political, business and public service leaders as well as around forty official White Ribbon Ambassadors.

The event was hosted by media identities Leigh McClusky and Peter Goers and guest speaker was Andrew O'Keefe, Chairman of the White Ribbon Foundation and well-known television presenter. The event was officially opened by the Governor of South Australia, His Excellency Kevin Scarce, accompanied by wife Liz, who is an Honorary Member of the Zonta Club of Adelaide Flinders.

Andrew O'Keefe gave a brilliant presentation and held the audience spellbound. Andrew began his career as a lawyer before changing direction to become the host of TV Channel 7's "Deal or No Deal" and "Weekend Sunrise" programs in Sydney. Andrew has been a White Ribbon campaigner since 2004, joined the White Ribbon Foundation Board, and was appointed Chairman in 2007. He was also a member of the inaugural National Council to Reduce Violence Against Women which drafted the Australian

National Plan to Reduce Violence Against Women and Their Children. To reinforce the message, a short video originally made for the AFL was shown, which had a profound impact on all present.

Although primarily an awareness-raising event, and not a fundraiser, we have many generous sponsors, which has allowed us to make contributions to several local community VAW projects as well as make a substantial contribution to the Australian White Ribbon Foundation.

The latest White Ribbon campaign "Hey Mate" is extremely dynamic and has been aired on radio and TV and is worth watching on their website www.whiteribbon.org.au along with details of the inaugural White Ribbon Conference to be held in Sydney in May 2013.
