Clubs are encouraged to develop their own biennial goals based on ZI & District 23 goals.

ZONTA INTERNATIONAL GOAL 1

We maximise our impact through service and advocacy initiatives and educational programs that empower women and girls.

DISTRICT 23 ACTIONS:

Service & Advocacy

- The Zonta Says No to Violence Against Women initiative is further developed to achieve local and national governmental commitment.
 - District 23 collaborates with Districts 22 & 24 to raise awareness regarding ending child marriage, and to continue national discussion regarding the elimination of violence against women and children.
 - District 23 will encourage all District 23 clubs to deliver an action to oppose child marriage by providing district specific resources in the form of presentations to be used at Area Meeting/Workshops and club meetings and information resources available on the District 23 website.
- District 23 reports new collaboration with two like-minded organisations to enhance our effectiveness in empowering women and girls.
 - Clubs in District 23 are encouraged to collaborate with new like-minded organisations and report these collaborations to Area Directors.
- District 23 clubs continue to participate in the District 23 Breast Cushion and Birthing Kit projects.

Education

- District 23 implements the pilot Women in Technology Scholarship program that encourages women to pursue a leadership role in technology, a field that will impact the next generation of women.
 - To facilitate District 23 club involvement in this pilot scholarship program, District 23 appoints a Co-Ordinator for this program.
- District 23 participates in Zonta's existing education programs Young Women in Public Affairs scholarship, Jane M Klausman Women in Business scholarship, Amelia Earhart fellowship:
 - District 23 Education Program Co-Ordinators assist clubs to participate in the education programs by disseminating information to appropriate timelines, and encouraging more District 23 clubs to participate than in the previous biennium

DISTRICT 23 ACTIONS:

Membership

- District 23 encourages District 23 clubs to enhance fellowship and mutual support of existing members, and to seek out new members who are motivated to join a global movement for women's rights. As a result, District 23 will have more members on 31 May 2020, than on 31 May 2018.
- District 23 and District 23 club service committees to maintain a list of past recipients of scholarship and education awards, as well as Golden Z Club members to create a data base which may be used for relationship building and networking opportunities.
- District 23 will continue to encourage District 23 clubs to charter student clubs as relevant service projects, and as a result, we will have more Z and Golden Z clubs on 31 May 2020 than on 31 May 2018.
- District 23 board members to complete Zonta International leadership training program and encourage club leaders to make use of this program to enhance their ability to effectively manage Zonta club business.

Finances

- All District 23 clubs make donations to the Zonta International Foundation, and these donations exceed the previous biennium total.
- District 23 Foundation Ambassador and Representatives to provide information and education on the power of endowment funds to provide long-term sustainability, including information on the Mary E. Jenkins 1919 Society.

Operations

 District 23 implements measures to enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of district operations by employing best practice financial management, communication strategies and strategic management.
