Bendigo is one of Australia's largest inland cities, supporting a local population of 112,000 and regional population of close to 240,000. Our location in the geographic centre of Victoria is two hours from Melbourne by road or train and a 90-minute drive from Melbourne Airport with the CBD only 10 minutes from Bendigo Airport.

### The Capital



The Capital, located on historic View Street, was originally built as the Sandhurst Masonic Hall in 1873 and boasts one of the finest entries of any arts centre in the nation, with towering Corinthian columns and an interior that has been restored to its original grandeur. The 480 seat capacity Capital Theatre sits above two elegant heritage chambers – The Capital's Banquet Room and the Bendigo Bank Theatre.
