HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION....

Attending a Zonta International Convention is always exciting and inspiring and the Vancouver Convention did not disappoint.

District 23 attendees led the way with the Zonta Says Now Walk prior to the commencement of the Convention.

We also enthusiastically joined the attendees from the other two Australian Districts to noisily proclaim our presence at the Opening Ceremony.

Attendees and guest partners enjoyed connecting with over 1,000 attendees from all around the world. It was a busy time of meeting up with friends from the past, making new friends, sharing Zonta Spirit and being inspired by Key Note Speakers . We were encouraged by the work that we have already achieved and focused on making decisions for the next two years to further enable our collective work and mission. Delegates diligently attended the business sessions and voted on our behalf including making decisions on the funding for our service projects for the next two years.

These include:

- Ending Child Marriage through UNFPA and UNICEF;
- Gender Transformation in Climate Adaptation through IFAD;
- Continuation of LAAHA: A Virtual Space for Women and Girls through UNICEF; and
- Our new Delegate's Choice project; Standing with Afghan Women; Expanding Community-led Solutions to End Gender-based Violence through UN Women.

We were all made aware of the significant changes that are being proposed for our Zonta International world in the coming years with a couple of the Business Sessions featuring the Blueprint for the Future. At the request of attendees, the period for consultation and feedback has been extended to the end of October. More about that later in the Newsletter.

We acknowledged the significant work of Salla Tuominen, International President leading the international board and committees over the last two years. We celebrated the installation of the new International President, Fernanda Gallo Freschi, President Elect, Sandy Venn-Brown, the new International Board and the Governors for our 32 Districts around the world.

D23 Zontians are proud of all that was achieved in the 2024-2026 biennium and

deeply thankful to outgoing Governor Debbie Schmidt and the 2024-2026 District board for their leadership.

2.	The following amendment pertains to the differentiation between clubs and e-clubs Article III Policy, Section 1*, and Article XIV Section 1 and 3 (to remove the difference – both are Clubs)	CARRIED (96.8%) (No difference between Clubs & E-Clubs, both are Clubs)
3.	The following amendments pertain to the rights of supporting members. Article IV Members, Section 3 (b) Rights (2) (to remove the right of supporting Members to serve on committees)	FAILED (42.3% for; 57.9% against) (supporting Members can serve on committees)
4.	The following amendment pertains to business meetings and voting. Article VI Business Meetings and Voting, Section 3 (In case of electronic meetings, including voting, the club President will automatically be considered as the delegate of the club unless ... etc. See the report.)	CARRIED (95.9%) (This is designed to make the credentialing process easier and possible at every point of time)
5.	The following amendment pertains to the disestablishment of the role of Zonta International vice president. Article VII Officers and Directors SECTION 1 d and e	CARRIED (86%) (at Convention 2028, a VP will not be elected)
6.	The following amendment pertains to broadening the pool of candidates available for board positions. Article VII Officers and Directors SECTION 1a and SECTION 2a.	CARRIED (87.2%) (serving on an International Committee is also a pathway to the ZI Board)
7.	The following amendment pertains to the number of directors on the International Board. Article VII SECTION 2 and Article VIII SECTION 1 (reduce International Directors/Board Members from 7 to 6)	CARRIED (82.6%) (therefore, at Convention 2028, only 6 will be elected)
8.	The following amendment pertains to the number of candidates for international director to be presented by the International Nominating Committee.	CARRIED (96.7%) This means that, if the number of positions is

	Article XII Zonta International Nominating Committee SECTION 6 ("convention" was changed to "elections" and "at least 14 candidates for election of seven directors" was changed to "the number of candidates shall be at least twice the number of directors to be elected".)	further reduced (as is planned under the Blueprint), it won't be necessary to change this clause again.
9.	The following amendment pertains to the President-Elect serving as an adviser to the International Nominating Committee. Article XII Zonta International Nominating Committee SECTION 1. How Constituted. There was an amendment proposed to replace the word 'shall' (in "shall be entitled to vote") to 'must', This amendment failed in a very close vote. There was an amendment proposed to strike out the words "The Zonta International President-Elect serves as an advisor, without a vote, to the committee". This amendment failed in a very close vote. Vigorous debate occurred for and against the overall motion, following the lines of the ZI Board's rationale, vs concerns about too much influence over the selection of candidates.	FAILED (This was an extremely close vote; 584 for vs 589 against) (The President-Elect will not serve as an advisor to the Nominating Committee)
10.	The following amendment pertains to broadening the pool of candidates for District nominating committees. Article XIV Districts, Section 13 Nominating Committee (b) (Those who serve at Area level are eligible to be on the International Nominating Committee)	CARRIED (92.5%)
11.	The following amendments pertain to providing more flexibility to clubs for their structure and operations. Article XV Clubs, Section 4-8 and 10-12 (There are numerous changes to Bylaws here. You need to look at all of these in more detail. Please see the Report. One involves having at least a President and Treasurer, however due to our local laws for Incorporated bodies, we need at least 3 Board Members. We can have more than 3. The maximum term for an office was removed. There was an amendment proposed for section 6 (b) and (c) to make this a 4-year maximum. This amendment was defeated.	CARRIED (75.1% for and 24.9% against) (After the amendments were dealt with, we voted <i>en bloc</i> for the whole motion)

	Elections are to be held at least every second year; however, our local laws apply, and we need an AGM every year. There was an amendment for Section 8 (b) to add before the existing text “The Club Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the club provided that none of its acts shall conflict with action taken by the club and shall perform such duties ... “. This amendment passed.)	
12.	The following amendment pertains to district conformation to the Zonta International Bylaws. Article XX Amendment to Bylaws, Section 4 (If they differ from Zonta International Bylaws, any other level of Zonta bylaws is deemed to be amended automatically)	CARRIED (97.7% for and 2.3% against)

The following is a proposed amendment to the Articles of Incorporation of Zonta International.

4	RESOLUTION regarding birthing kits (to have a link to BKFA on the ZI website) (Debate against this motion echoed the ZI Board’s rationale in the report and this motion was resoundingly defeated)	FAILED (84.7% and 15.3% against)
5	RESOLUTION to declare a peace initiative by Zonta International (An amendment by the ZI Board to change ‘declare’ to “work towards” passed. The ZI Board then supported the motion)	CARRIED (74%)
6	RESOLUTION regarding business meetings and voting (to have electronic voting for motions at Convention) (The debate against this motion echoed the ZI Board’s	FAILED (81.4% against)

	rationale in the report and this motion was resoundingly defeated)	
7	RESOLUTION regarding “Legacy membership” for members over the age of 85 (An amendment to make the age 75, failed, then the vote for the original motion also failed)	FAILED (78.5% against)

identified **urgent structural issues that need to be addressed to ensure Zonta International remains sustainable and “fit for the future”**.

The proposed Governance Blueprint could represent one of the most significant changes in Zonta’s 107-year history. Importantly, Australian members have an opportunity to help shape how any new structure would work in Australia.

What is happening in Australia?

Following the July 2026 Zonta International Convention, the Governors of **Districts 22, 23 and 24** formed the **Fit for the Future Project: Australia Steering Committee**. Together, these three districts represent **95 Australian Zonta clubs**.

The aim is to explore what a future **country-based Zonta structure in Australia** should look like and, most importantly, what it needs to provide to effectively support **clubs, members, service and advocacy**.

What happens next?

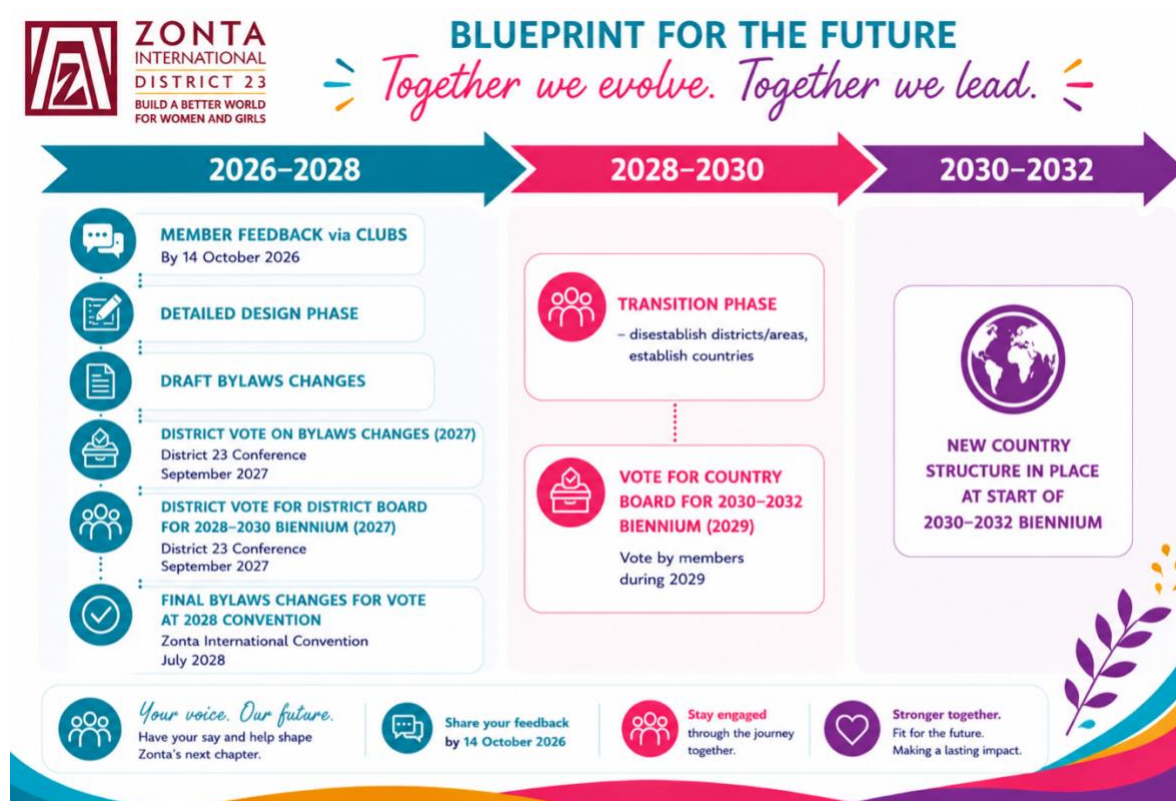
The Steering Committee will consult widely with members, clubs, District Boards, Lieutenant Governors, Zonta International leadership, Zonta Australia and other key members.

Every member and every club can have a say. Feedback gathered through the Australian project will help inform the response provided to Zonta International.

The key question is:

What should a future Zonta Australia structure look like so that it strengthens our clubs, supports our members and increases our impact for women and girls?

The Women Taking Climate Action Award - \$1000 (WTCA) recognises women whose climate actions significantly contributes towards mitigating the negative aspects of climate change and their climate action engages with women. The award was created in partnership with Zonta Says Now. It has been voted as a District 23 project for 2024-6, and again for 2026-8.

The Women Taking Climate Action Award was selected as one of six *Projects of Inspiring Impact* for the Zonta International **Share Your Story Festival 2025**.

The award is managed for District 23 by the Zonta Club of Melbourne on Yarra (ZCMOY),
District 23 Clubs are asked to make a financial contribution of at least \$50 to contribute to a \$1000 award, and to advertise the award to prospective applicants in their areas. Please advertise award on social media, newsletters etc.

The D23 Board 2026-2028 making decisions in Hobart August 15th

The D23 Board met in Hobart August 14-16.

We agreed on the following dates and locations for the 2027 Area Meetings:
